Dear Steering Committee Members,

Dawson College is the largest College in the CEGEP network of Quebec and prides itself as a leader in sustainability. After receiving feedback from over 1000 staff and students in 2015 for the development of the next strategic plan, it was clear that sustainability was still a major topic on the community's mind. This was translated into bold statements within the College's mission, vision and strategic plan. Our resulting sustainability plan created ambitious goals, one of which was to be a leader in sustainability endeavours and to reach for the AASHE Gold Level. The STARS Report will demonstrate what the Dawson community has accomplished within academic, operational, engagement and administration sectors, but several initiatives stand out.

Our College is mandated to be carbon responsible (neutral) forever. This unanimous vote by the board was a commitment to all students and staff that we were serious in our efforts. We have developed extensive peace and non-violence programs through our Peace Centre and have initiated a peace certificate for students. The Sustainable Happiness Certificate, a concept that explores how being engaged in sustainable projects contributes to well-being, was developed here and Dawson will be the Canadian hub for training.

This has inspired a Living Schools movement in other colleges, schools and primary schools here and abroad. In short, Dawson students and staff have gone beyond the bar set with bold goals years ago and are contributing to national efforts to strengthen sustainability work.
